01 Community/Agency Partnerships

"On the Street and in the Classroom"

Approximately 30 6th grade students at the Dunbarton Elementary School ("DES") graduated from the **LEAD - Law Enforcement Against Drugs and Violence's "Too Good for Drugs" ("TGFD")** program on Friday, April 12th 2024. This marks the third class at DES to graduate since the program was implemented during the 2021-2022 school year. To

date, over 100 Dunbarton students have graduated from the program.

Over the past several months, we taught a total of ten (10) lessons which included the topics of setting reachable goals, making responsible decisions, identifying and managing emotions, effective communication, bonding and relationships, the effects of alcohol, tobacco and nicotine, the safe use of prescription and over-the-counter medicines, and the dangers of street drugs.

The goal of the TGFD program is to build children's social-emotional skills and empower them to be strong learners, make healthy choices, and be more resistant to peer pressure and peer influence. Children who learn and use the skills taught in this program are more likely to have a positive attitude, make good decisions, get along with their peers, and do better in school.

To celebrate their hard work and dedication, each student was given a graduation certificate and LEAD graduate sticker. The graduation was topped off with a cupcake and cookie party! We would like to thank all of the faculty and staff at DES that provided assistance as well as the Dunbarton Elementary PTO for their continued support of this program. 
